Undergraduate: not all subjects are taught every semester.

Postgraduate courses: postgraduate courses (Master's or PhD) require the admission of the degree's coordinator.

Research internships: admission subject to approval by the relevant research division.

Accreditation

UNSAM is working to establish its own credit system, which will be based on the student's total workload and will be compatible with other systems such as the European system (ECTS).

In the meantime, we provide the following reference information:

A full-time student at UNSAM takes approximately three subjects of 64 hs each term (which only consider the contact time between the professor and the students). This means

that 192 contact hours would be equivalent to one full time semester in the European system, i.e. 30 ECTS. Based on this information, each university will have to evaluate how many credits are assigned to each subject.

Language

B2 level of Spanish or equivalent is required.

The Language Program offers language courses for a fee.

Accommodation

UNSAM does not have its own residence halls, nor does it have any arranged housing.

Health Insurance

Exchange students must have life and health insurance with the following characteris-tics: medical and health coverage, death and disability due to accidents, assistance in repatriation of the deceased for any cause and reimbursement of medical expenses due to accidents during the period of stay in Argentina.

Visa

In order to obtain accreditation of the courses taken at UNSAM, the student should have a student visa.
